Professor Siam Bhayro (University of Exeter)

'Judaeo-Syriac: Fragmentary Evidence for Jewish-Christian Scholarly and Technical Collaboration in the Middle Ages'

Siam Bhayro is Associate Professor in Early Jewish Studies at the University of Exeter. His research interests include the Bible, Semitic languages, the history of magic and medicine in the Near East, and Jewish and Christian history in Late Antiquity and the Middle Ages.

Abstract

It has been known for some time that medieval Jewish scholars engaged with Syriac Christian scholarship on matters of biblical interpretation, and, in doing so, produced phonetic transcriptions of Syriac texts in Jewish Aramaic script. Recent discoveries from the Cairo Geniza have extended such "Judaeo-Syriac" endeavours to secular, scientific disciplines. This lecture will discuss the various sources and their significance for our understanding of Jewish-Christian scholarly collaboration in the Middle Ages.
