'Jewish Mysticism in the 17th-18th century Ashkenazi Society: Translating the Zohar in Old Yiddish'

Jean Baumgarten is Emeritus Directeur de recherche at the CNRS, École des hautes études en sciences sociales (EHESS), Centre de recherches historiques (CRH, Paris).

Abstract: From the 17th century onwards, we observe an evolution in Old Yiddish literature with the introduction of many kabbalistic references and quotations to illustrate practical advice and rules intended to regulate and control human behaviours, religious rituals and practices. What kind of references and excerpts from mystical books were inserted, which themes were emphasised and for which readership these texts were printed? Our lecture will be based on the translation of parts of the Zohar, the *Nahalat Tsevi* (1711) and on an ethical treatise, the *Kav ha-Yashar* (1709). The incorporation of mystical texts into popular Jewish literature could be considered as a sign of the transformation of Ashkenazi traditional culture between the 17th and 18th centuries.
